



















1. Inform students that now we are going to add more sounds to our puffy tongue. We are going to start with our puffy tongue "a" and add long vowels. These are the vowels that say their name.
2. Teach making a puffy tongue "a" and sliding your voice into a long "A". Repeat for the other vowels. Note not to say the "U" letter, but instead change it to "oo" to avoid the consonant sound. Use the picture and the video lesson to demonstrate.
3. Have students practice sliding their puffy tongue "a" into each vowel.
4. Give student the laminated practice page. For each picture that they touch (or cover with a bingo chip), practice another puffy tongue with vowel.
7. Send the student home with the worksheet to practice their puffy tongue in front of a mirror at home.
